PHILOSOPHY OF ASSESSMENT

At SV High, assessments are continuous and constructive in nature. Student assessments are embedded in the teaching and learning process. The assessment activities are designed to inform instructions and provide evidence of learning for the skills and the concepts which the students are expected to master at each level. Each student is appraised more against his or her individual progress rather than against the class.

Continuous assessment occurs frequenctly during the school year and is part of regular teacher- pupil interactions. It is a powerful diagnostic tool that enables pupil to understand the areas in which they are having difficulty and to concentrate their efforts in those areas.

The progress of the learners is reported twice a year with qualitative feedback and intervention plans to help them improve on their areas of weakness and reach their potential in their areas of strength.

OUR ANNUAL AWARDS

Awards and recognition can be great motivating factors for the learners to develop and

sustain learning habits and further their engagement with various co-curricular activites. Our awards are non-competitive; encourage our learners to set goals for themselves and put in their best efforts to achieve them.

Our annual awards are:

Progression Award: A non competitive award given for learners who show progress in their subject competency levels.

Goal Setting and Achievement Award: An award, which recognizes the learners for their SMART Goals and acknowledges their journey to achieve it.

Scholastic Performance: This award recognizes the learners for their merit in scholastic areas. The award is noncompetitive in nature as it is awarded to as many learners qualifying for the category.

Holistic growth: This award recognizes the learners who demonstrate positive attitudes with deep engagement in all the areas of schooling.

Co--curricular awards: These awards are given for the learner's achievement in Intra--School events.

Student Led Conference:

Held twice in a year, Student Led Conference (SLC) is a tripartite conference between the learner, the parent and the teacher where the learner presents and reflects on his/her learning with the parents and discusses the next course of action. The teacher here merely acts as a facilitator and allows the child to take the ownership of this conference.

Portfolio Presentation:

At the end of each term, the KG and the Primary learners will present their portfolio to their parents. They will showcase the body of work done for various knowledge domains and will reflect on their learning outcomes.

COMMUNICATION WITH THE PARENTS

All important information from the school will be notified through the school e-mail id. It is therefore important that parents provide active email ids for seamless communication and check their emails every day.

Parents can also communicate to the school via admin.vanagaram@svhigh.in

For any emergency parents will be contacted on the contact numbers given to the school at the time of admission. It is very important to keep the school informed of any changes in the contact details so that our records are up to date.

Important days for parent interactions:

- 1. Parent Orientation: This is conducted at the beginning of the academic year to share the plans for the year, bring clarity on the functioning of the school and set mutual expectations.
- 2. Student Led Conferences (SLC): Parents of KG grade 8 are invited for the SLC after every term. Students present their portfolio of work and share their reflections on their learning journey with the parents. The child's progress is discussed and the goal for the next term is set. Parents presence is a great encouragement for the learners and therefore all parents must attend the SLC as per the schedule.
- Parent Teacher Meeting (PTM): PTM will be organized based on the need for it. Parents can request for a meeting with the teacher and vice—versa to discuss and resolve any matter concerning the performance and the well being of the child.
- 4. Special Meetings with the school coordinators or the Head of School: If any parent wants to discuss any sensitive matter or any concern which may have not been addressed

to satisfaction, he/she can book an appointment with the School Coordinator or the Head of School through the office via email to admin.vanagaram@svhigh.in

HOW SV HIGH WORKS

1. Arrival and Departure from the school campus:

The school functions from Monday through Friday. The school timings are as follows:

Kindergarten: 9 am – 12 Noon
 Grades 1 – 5: 8.15 am – 2.45 pm.
 Grades 6-8: 8.15 am – 3 pm

Students are expected to be in school at least 5 minutes before the first bell.

Parents/ guardians of students who use their own transport are requested to organize the pick up between 3 pm to 3.15 pm. Private vehicles will not be allowed in the school parking area before 3 pm.

On account of the safety reasons please note the following:

- Drivers or members of the extended family coming to pick up the child must carry the Identity Card issued by the school.
- No office colleague/ family friend is allowed to pick the children up from school. If such a need arise in case of any emergency, the class teacher has to be notifed by the parent/guardian.
- Any change in the child's normal arrival or departure routine should be notified to the class teacher by the parents.
- Request of pick up and drop off at any point other than the assigned stop will not be accepted.
- The school does not encourage any deviation from the departure routine such as, going home with a friend's parent, going to friend's place directly from school etc.

Attendance:

The school will record and monitor the attendance of the students. In order to optimize the learning experiences, it is important for all the students to be regular to school. However, due to any reason if a student needs to avail leave, parents/guardians are requested to keep the class teacher informed through a note or an email stating the reasons for absence. This is a mandatory school procedure. The leave format is provided at the end of the handbook.

For prolonged absence due to unavoidable circumstances, it is important that the parent/ guardian meet the class teacher to explain the reasons for such leave and take the responsibility of checking the assignments, notes and other information from the school. Any request for re—teaching due to prolonged absence will be considered only after the approval of the Head of School.

3. Unplanned Closure:

Any emergency or unplanned closure due to cyclone warning, government order, strikes etc. will be communicated to the parents directly over the phone via a message. Efforts will be made to communicate such information as soon as possible to avoid any inconvenience to the child. If situation permits, the school will switch to online classes during these times. All the students are expected to attend these classes as per the instructions sent by the school.

4. School Uniform:

Uniform helps in identifying with the school and creates a sense of belonging. The school has a uniform and all the students are expected to adhere to it as prescribed for their grades.

<u>Kindergarten:</u> School T--shirt with any matching bottom can be worn on the days as given below:

KG: On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays.

On non-uniform days, students are expected to wear comfortable clothes, preferably a T---shirt with shorts/ jeans.

Footwear: The school recommends shoes or sandals with Velcro or slip—ons. Shoes with laces should not be worn to avoid tripping or falling due to lose or untied laces.

Uniform will have to be worn in case any field trip is scheduled on a non-uniform day.

<u>Grade 1 onwards:</u> School uniform T--shirt and Half pants/skirts/pants, should be worn on all the working days by all the students from grade 1 onwards.

Footwear: White sneakers with white socks

Parents will be informed in advance in case of any change in the uniform code on account of festival or important day celebration.

All students must come to school in neat uniform, following hygienic practices such as trimmed nails, well kept hair and clean shoes.

No jewelry except for ear studs will be allowed. Wearing or carrying any kind of make—up or perfume is not allowed. Girls with hair below the shoulder level are expected to tie/plait their hair with a sturdy clip/ rubber band. Boys are expected to keep their hair short and trimmed for a neat and smart look.

5. Medical emergencies, allergies, sickness or medical issues:

It is compulsory for a parent to fill in the medical form given at the end of the handbook to inform the school about any food/drug allergy or/ and any medical condition a child may have. Parents/guardian may be asked to meet the school nurse and the class teacher to explain the symptoms and the emergency medication for it.

Children who are ill should not be sent to school. Parents are expected to send a leave note to the class teacher informing about the absence. In case of prolonged absence due to any illness a medical certificate will have to be submitted.

It is advised that the child is kept at home in case of any contagious illness and be sent to school only after submitting a certificate of fitness by a practicing doctor. If any student demonstrates symptoms of any such illness, the school, keeping the wellbeing of other students in mind will ask him/her to go home and will keep the child isolated till he/she is picked up from the school.

The class teacher should be informed if the child's medical condition or treatment necessitates exemption from certain activities like sports, sunlight exposure etc.

The school has an infirmary with a trained nurse and a doctor on call to provide first aid. However, in case further medical help is needed, parents will have to come to school to take the child for further medical consultation /investigation.

6. Celebrations:

All important festivals and days mentioned in the school calendar will be celebrated in

school with the approach — first educate and then celebrate. Students will be made aware of the significance of the festival, the rituals associated with it.

Children up to grade 6 are allowed to celebrate their birthdays with their classmates by distributing a simple chocolate or a home made sweet. Lavish celebrations and gifts / return gifts are strictly prohibited.

Nothing in cash or kind can be given as gifts or as a token of appreciation to any member of the school community. If you wish to contribute to school or help the support staff, please hand over the gift/ cash to the office, which will ensure equal distribution amongst all the members of the support staff.

7. Participation in school events:

It is important that all the students participate in the co-curricular activities and school events. During such events, the event coordinator will take the responsibility of providing every student with the opportunity to showcase their talent. Parents are discouraged to interfere in this regard and rather requested to encourage their child to make the best use of the opportunity provided.

8. Field trips:

Field trips are essential part of learning. No textbook or classroom explanations can substitute for the knowledge and the first hand information acquired by the students during such trips. The school will arrange for short day trips within the city limits during the academic year. Parents will be informed in advance and asked to sign the consent form for their ward.

Participating students must wear the school uniform, carry enough water and should bring along other items as suggested by the school. Parents may be invited to volunteer as chaperone along with the teachers.

9. School Excursions and Picnics:

School excursions are a great way of learning several life skills. It can also be a way to have fun and recreation and act as a stress buster for the students. The school will organize purposeful outbound excursion trips for students from grade 6 onwards. The duration could be anywhere between 3 days to 5 days depending upon the location and the itinerary of the trips. All participating students are expected to wear the school uniform during the onward and return journey and at all times during the transit travel.

The students are expected to adhere to all the norms established by the school and the partnering organization. The school will take firm action against any transgression during the trip.

Picnics and fun days are great ways for the students to enjoy with their classmates. The school will organize one picnic during the academic year for grades LKG--- Grade 5

10. Electronic and other expensive items:

Students are not permitted to have in their possession cell phones, I—pads, MP3 Players or any other electronic entertainment devices during school hours inside the school premises. In case any student needs to bring laptop for any presentation, the permission card from the concerned teacher is a must for the device to be taken

into the classroom.

Students are discouraged from bringing expensive and fancy stationery items. The school assumes no responsibility for the loss or theft of valuables, cash, expensive jewelry, electronic devices and fancy stationery items.

11. Use of School facilities:

All the members of the school community are expected to use the school property and the facilities in a responsible manner. Any misuse, defacing, or/ and damaging the school property including the school bus will attract a consequence proportionate to the act.

The management reserves the right to expect a replacement or compensation for any deliberate damage.

Students are encouraged to keep the campus litter free and be proactive in maintaining cleanliness of the school.

12. IT Policy

Smart boards and computers are networked to the school server and are enabled with high—speed Internet access to facilitate learning and research for educational purpose. All the students are expected to use the computers and other IT facilities as per the rules and the procedures laid down by the school. They must refrain from installing any hardware/software, visiting or downloading material from unsuitable sites or passing such material to other students. The school has net filters in place to protect children from undesirable material. No student is allowed internet access without teacher supervision. Inappropriate use of technology will not be taken lightly and will attract serious consequences.

13. School Library rules:

Every student will be provided a non-transferable borrower's ticket at the beginning of the new session which is to be produced before the librarian to get books issued from the library. No student shall sub-lend the books issued by the library. Borrowers must satisfy themselves about the physical condition of the books before borrowing or else they shall be held responsible for any

damage or mutilation noticed at the time of returning. If the book is lost, the reader has to pay the cost of the book (1½ times the cost) or replace the book within 20 days. Students must return the book on the given due date. Late fine will be charged Rs. 2.00 per day per volume after the due date. All the students must participate in the Library activites of the school.

14. Online classes:

The school will function physically as per the school calendar. However when this is not possible, due to any exigency beyond the control of the school, virtual classes will be conducted as per the instructions sent by the school. During such periods, the school will make changes in the timetable and school hours keeping the opportunities and the challenges of online learning in mind. The school will release a guideline for the students and the parents detailing the changes, the learning platform, the school's plan and the support expected from the parent. Even though online learning provides incredible learning opportunities for the students yet some aspects of SV High education may not transfer easily to online environment. The school will ensure that alternative and collaborative approaches are used to help the students achieve the learning outcomes of the syllabus.

15. Language policy:

The official language of the school is English and all communication with the school community is in English. It is also the medium of instruction and is taught as the First Language, preparing students become proficient in listening, speaking, reading, writing and comprehending the content

Keeping in mind the social and emotional readiness of the children in the Kindergarten, the school adopts a multilingual approach for communication. However, the medium of instruction will remain English with the focus on exposure, and vocabulary building.

The scope and sequence of learning language across the school levels will be as follows:

Kindergarten:

Oral--- Listening and Speaking

Primary School:

Listening, Speaking, Presenting, Reading and Writing

Middle School:

Listening, Speaking, Presenting, Reading, Writing and Analyzing

We firmly believe in the importance of the mother tongue in the holistic development of learners and encourage them to learn their mother tongue. The school also encourages the students to pursue learning other languages, as this contributes to the cultural awareness. From grade 1 onwards, the school offers Tamil and Hindi as second and third language options.

16. Raising concerns:

SV High is committed to high standards of education in a secure, calm and welcoming environment for its students. We recognize that this can only be achieved by a wholehearted commitment and support of the entire school community. Occasionally, situations will occur which prevent the fulfillment of these aims and give cause for complaint. Therefore, in the spirit of true partnership between parents, school and the community, we welcome suggestions, feedback, and views about the actions, omissions and conduct of staff employed at the school. As a first level escalation, parents can contact the class teacher to express dissatisfaction about any aspect of school either verbally or in written form. Every effort by the school will be made to resolve the matter at that point itself, however if it is not resolved satisfactorily, the next level of escalation can be made to the school coordinator. The school intends for the matters to be dealt with swiftly, fairly and openly without any prejudice.

SCHOOL DISCIPLINE

Inculcating discipline amongst children is the most significant aspect of education and is not confined to school alone. - Bringing items that disrupts the class/ school environment and /or are harmful in nature.
- Bringing cash or valuables to school. (Not more than

Rs. 100 is allowed as an emergency amount)

 Drive motorized vehicles within or outside the school without a valid license.

Handling non-conformities:

The school will not compromise on any breach of rules or misdemeanor that affects student's learning, wellbeing and the school's reputation. Our approach to handling non--conformities will include positive behavior support using Restorative disciplinary practices. This is a relational approach to building positive school climate as it fosters a sense of belonging, connectedness and willingness to change instead of fear, uncertainty and punishment.

The school will use its discretion and seek the child's permission to involve the parent in the disciplinary process. However this involvement will be non-negotiable if the behavior causes a potential harm to the child or others around him and warrants parent's inputs.

The school reserves the right to pronounce consequences in proportion to the act and the developmental stage of the child for repeated misconduct/ offences and a failed attempt with restorative disciplinary practices.
